Big Oak Ranch exists to meet the needs of abused, neglected and abandoned children by giving them a solid, Christian home and a chance to realize and fulfill God's plan for their lives.





What Was Still Is.

If I could begin from a personal perspective, this statement is one of the most affirming I've received since welcoming the honor of leading this incredible organization more than 10 years ago. As my mom was asked recently by a group curious about our catalyst for growth in what is unfortunately a shrinking field of service, her words spoke over me that we are carrying Big Oak's and my family's original calling well.

During a difficult time for our nation's most vulnerable children, Big Oak is growing. We are doing so because we've never wavered in the fact that children thrive most when a part of a home where God is honored and the guidance of a dedicated, loving mom and dad runs deep.

A half-century of giving children a chance has taught us that generational change happens by choice, but starts with **one child** at a time.

Each child's unique past can range from abuse, neglect, abandonment or all three. We choose to see their associated challenges, their unique needs in order to heal and their unique design, gifts and abilities. One child at a time, we develop a plan to help them succeed at Big Oak for the long term. An invaluable pillar in the plan is to carefully and intentionally choose the right houseparents for that unique child. As diverse as our children's pasts, so are the pasts of our houseparents. Ranging in childhood experiences themselves and in former careers that span nursing, teaching, law enforcement, international missions and more, they bring their own unique designs, gifts and abilities for the betterment of our children. One child at a time, we evaluate their pairing with our houseparents and identify the best long-term match.

One family at a time is formed as this plan unfolds for the mom, dad and up to eight children who live in each of our 25 homes. Time has shown us the importance of the longevity of our houseparents' leadership as it serves as a catalyst to our children experiencing family. Vital training,

accountability to that training and Spirit-filled community are invested into our houseparents and children by providing home where we believe family takes place and the center of where our promises of love, honesty, perseverance and discipline are put into action.

One new lineage at a time begins with each of the more than 2,000 children who've called Big Oak home. Lines of future families, because of God's work through one child at a time, will make the turn to His path, which offers the Hope that still changes everything. It starts with one child at a time, but the impact is eternal.

What we do is not new. It's the God-designed model for the family and for the calling we have to lead people to the One who gives beauty for ashes. And, while what we do is not new, it is our turn. As you read this report, we hope you are as passionately committed as we are to continue ensuring that "our turn" always upholds what was and still is to come.

Since 1974, Big Oak has been called to meet the needs of over 2,000 children who have come to us from all across the United States and from various backgrounds and unique circumstances. While they are all different, they have in common a past full of heartbreak and difficulty. Most have never known unconditional love or the stability of a true home. Their lives were too often filled with fear, pain and uncertainty. Everything changes when they join our family. We provide them with a safe, loving home and point them toward the true source of Hope, healing and restoration, which becomes their new common ground.

From a farmhouse serving five boys to six ministry teams dedicated to continually improving the standard of care for children who need a chance, Big Oak has been given an opportunity to advance the mission of loving, long-term, Christian homes nationwide. BIG OAK RANCH OUR WHY

THE BOYS' RANCH

The Big Oak ministry grew out of the desire to give hurting children a chance. John Croyle founded Big Oak Boys' Ranch in 1974 after working a summer camp and meeting a little boy from the streets of New Orleans whose mother was a prostitute, and he was banker and timekeeper for his mother.

John shared with him how he could become a Christian, and the boy returned to the same camp the following summer and shared how Jesus had changed his life. This moment led to a clear calling to relieve the suffering of children. Since that time, the Boys' Ranch has grown from a farmhouse serving 5 boys into **474 acres**, a gym and children's center, **14 residential homes**, two resource homes, two retreat homes, a food shed, a cattle facility, an equine center and Outfitters (a store which where our boys can purchase items with points earned). The Boys' Ranch was rooted in Isaiah 61:3 which tells us, "They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified."







The Girls' Ranch is a place where families embody love, perseverance, honesty, and discipline in an effort to point children to Jesus, who provides hope and healing.

The vision to start the Girls' Ranch evolved from a court case involving "Shelley," a 12-year-old girl who had been physically and sexually abused by her father. Big Oak pleaded with the judge to let Shelley live at the Boys' Ranch, but the judge refused and placed Shelley back with her parents. Shelley was beaten to death by her parents three months later. The Girls' Ranch was built in 1988 in Shelley's memory and rests on the promise of Genesis 50:20, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives." The Girls' Ranch has now grown into **325 acres**, a gym and children's center, **12 residential homes**, a chapel, two retreat homes, a food shed, an equine center and cattle facility, and the Boutique (a store where our girls can purchase items with points earned) and a space to serve our Planting Oaks partners.







THE BEGINNING

When we began Big Oak Cattle in 2014, we wanted to build a self-sustaining production system for naturally raised beef that could help feed the families of Big Oak. Today, Big Oak Cattle includes more than 100 pairs of Black Angus cow/calf pairs and 225 acres of fenced pasture land. The Boys' Ranch is home to most of our herd and a feeder calf operation while the Girls' Ranch is home to the remaining cattle. BOC is committed to having the top bloodlines and genetic make-up in our livestock, producing calves with superior marbling, docility, ribeye, and low birth weight. But that's not its true mission.

WHY BIG OAK CATTLE EXISTS

A cattle operation is hard work; it teaches responsibility and accountability because the animals depend on you for everything. It requires a great investment of time and energy, and it teaches a strong work ethic. It's an opportunity for our houseparents and staff to teach lost skills as they complete Ranch chores together, including checking gates, repairing fence lines, providing for the animals, and much more. We've learned that few things help a child grow in trust and belief more than working with animals. As our children care for the horses and cattle, their nurturing spirits develop.

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS

As we were in the planning phase of our 50th Anniversary Celebration, we knew we wanted our children to be the highlight of the day... and what an awesome day it was! Over 1,500 people came out to the Boys' Ranch for a delicious hamburger dinner featuring our premium Big Oak Cattle beef and to watch our P21 Rodeo where our kids got to show off the skills they learned over the summer.

Our ASCENDants now live in community, both socially and physically, at ASCEND in Birmingham. This 2.32 acre and 45,770 square feet of living and

learning space was meticulously planned to provide enough independence for students, but not without the support of fellow ASCENDants as well as on-site Village Guides.

There are millions of children across the country who need intervention on their behalf. We continue to scale toward 20 homes each at the Boys' Ranch and Girls' Ranch over the next decade in order to meet the needs of children from all across the nation who need a safe, loving home, while retaining the culture and community that is most beneficial for our children.

Planting Oaks is one of our paths to even more impact as we come alongside those who share our same passion and mission to help them get their ministries off the ground or grow already-established ministries in a way that is affordable, scalable and most effective in their area of service.

Each of our Planting Oaks partners is unique in terms of organizational structure and focus, whether it is long-term residential care, long-term placement for children rescued from human trafficking, long-term foster care communities or transitional living for those aging out of foster care. Each of their visions

for helping children in need is as unique as our partnership timing. Wherever our Planting Oaks are when they come to us, we meet them there because as unique as our ministries are, we have one vital commonality — a dedication to provide safe, loving, Christian homes to children in need of a chance.





We bring value to organizations committed to serving children in need as many organizations are "high-heart" but lack strong business capabilities, while others are businessminded and can lean on us to help fill gaps in childcare knowledge and culture building. As the network comes together, collaborative, diverse groups are comprised of people who aren't competing, but bringing best practices to the table to meet diverse needs within the realm of child welfare...this results in sweeping change. A network of referrals is also formed, which adds immediate lift to the solutions we seek by coming together.

News of Baby Isabella's arrival spread quickly! As their time in Germany came to an end, Dakota and Kerith brought "Bells" home to meet her Big Oak family.





McKENNA'S STORY

At nine years old, Melody remembers praying: "Dear God, I want a new place to live. One where I can have a mom and a dad. I want to have a house with a trampoline, and horses, and a swimming pool. I want a lake where I can fish and a bunch of kids my age to play with. I don't ever want to have to change schools again." God answered her prayer. Through the support of Big Oak and a fantastic education at Westbrook Christian School, Melody received a full ride to Jacksonville State University and went on to receive her Master's in Clinical Nutrition at UAB, which also led to her meeting her husband, Matt, at the library while studying for an exam. Matt and Melody now live near Destin, FL, where he works as a family nurse practitioner. We felt so much joy hearing that Melody and Matt were expecting a baby girl! On Tuesday, August 27, Mel's social media post read, "Our September Baby couldn't wait and decided to be an August Baby! McKenna is here and healthy, and Matt and I couldn't be more grateful." We quickly reached out to the new parents to celebrate Baby McKenna and another cycle broken!

As we reflect on the work your support enables us to do, we are thankful for our houseparents and staff that surround and carry out our mission of Hope - pouring into the children who currently live at Big Oak. We are grateful for those that paved the way and poured into our Former Residents, the Big Oak connections that will always tie us together and the many other Stories of Hope that are being lived out, just like Melody's and Dakota's. 


