






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A Letter from Brodie

At Big Oak Ranch, we pursue excellence—not for its own sake, but because we have witnessed the impact it has in creating a place that welcomes the presence of God. Within that environment, our children experience His comfort, peace and strength. They begin to imagine what their futures could be—and, most importantly, desire it for themselves.

We will not stop pursuing children in need. As long as there are young lives enduring abuse, neglect and abandonment, we will continue to stand in the gap. As we look to the future, we carry the same spirit of excellence—not only in what we build, but in how we grow. We do so because these children need more than rescue—they need restoration. We know the One who provides it, and every part of our ministry exists to point our children to Jesus in every season of their lives.

OUR CORE MINISTRIES ARE THRIVING AND EXPANDING.

What began in 1974—when John and Tee Croyle chose to give away what was never meant to be kept to themselves—has grown into a lasting legacy. Their open arms of love, refuge and guidance created a place where children in need could discover the restoring power of the Gospel. That same posture continues today at Big Oak Boys' Ranch and Big Oak Girls' Ranch where we now witness more than 200 children experiencing the guidance of the Big Oak Ranch family and so many professing their faith in Christ, reaching academic milestones that previously seemed unattainable and not only participating in life-changing initiatives but leading them.

This year, we launched Big Oak Ranch Communities with that same heart—doing whatever it takes to ensure foster children experience the same love and belonging that has been provided through the Big Oak Ranch family for more than 50 years.

OUR GROWTH IS VITAL—BECAUSE THE NEED DEMANDS IT.

Why do more?

The millions—children across our country in need of help.

The thousands—approximately 6,000 children in Alabama's foster care system, with less than half that number of foster homes.

The percentage—almost 40% annual turnover rate within the child welfare workforce.

Why do more? The need—and therefore our mission—demands it.

“The question is not, ‘Why more?’ It’s, ‘Why not?’”*

We remain committed to giving away what was never meant to be kept to ourselves. Your willingness—your obedience to the Lord, your dedication to seeing hurting children restored—helps fuel the relentless pursuit of these core ministries.

OUR GROWTH IS TETHERED TO WHAT WAS.

My mom often says of Big Oak Ranch's growth mentality, “What was still is.” And it's true. Our very first articles of incorporation and business plan still describe our growing mission well. It described the early Big Oak Ranch venture not only as a home led by a Christian mother and father who “provide the basic necessities in an atmosphere of Christian love and discipline,” but a mechanism to produce in our children “qualities that would last a lifetime thus making them an asset to a confused, chaotic society.” It emphasized our defining influence as a “relationship with Jesus Christ, through the leadership of Christian parents at Big Oak Ranch, that is an everyday experience of life, not a mask to wear on certain days of the week.”

That's why the word Christian will always be the anchoring descriptor of our mission and a part of our name. There will always be room for more children. We will continue to operate 100% debt-free and take no state or federal funds.

Our Ministries

At Big Oak Ranch, our ministries work together to give abused, neglected, and abandoned children a real chance at life. Our core ministries offer loving, Christ-centered homes, while our support ministries prepare them for adulthood, build life skills, and expand our mission through partnerships. Collectively, these ministries create a lifelong journey of healing, growth, and purpose for every child we serve.

CORE MINISTRIES

We provide children who have faced abuse, abandonment, and neglect with the love, stability, and structure of a Christian home. Through lifelong relationships with godly parents and siblings, they find safety, healing, and the opportunity to thrive.

BIG OAK BOYS' RANCH

A home for boys in need of family, structure and the opportunity to be a part of something greater than themselves.

BIG OAK GIRLS' RANCH

A home for girls seeking belonging, safety and purpose.

BIG OAK RANCH COMMUNITIES

A home for foster children through supported family neighborhoods.

SUPPORT MINISTRIES

These ministries extend the impact of our core by preparing our children for adulthood, teaching real-world skills, and empowering others to care for children in need. Each plays a vital role in strengthening the foundation built at Big Oak Ranch.

CATTLE

Develops work ethic and confidence through hands-on agricultural experience.

ASCEND

Holistically prepares young adults for life beyond the Ranch.

WESTBROOK CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

Provides our grade school children with an exceptional education to help reach their potential.

PLANTING OAKS

Equipping families and ministries to provide stable, Christ-centered homes for vulnerable children.



Big Oak Ranch Communities

Approximately 6,000 children in Alabama are part of the foster care system, and with less than half that number of foster homes, the need is hard to ignore. Big Oak Ranch is committed to helping abused, abandoned and neglected children, and not just within the rolling hills of our Ranches.

In 2025, we started our third core ministry, Big Oak Ranch Communities, to alleviate not only the strain on the overburdened foster care system, but as way to reach even more children in need. The ministry is based at The Hub, which opened in spring 2025 at Big Oak Girls' Ranch in Springville. Provided by the generous donation of Ken and Patricia Hubbard, The Hub is a special place where the heartbeat of our mission grows stronger and extends farther, uniting the vital work of Communities, Planting Oaks, and their connections to Big Oak Ranch Childcare.

Our first set of homes is already nestled into an established community and will continue to grow, all licensed through Planting Oaks, Child Placing Agency. Within each home are foster parents, trained by Big Oak Ranch and certified by the state, who care for up to five children.

These supportive neighborhoods provide loving, caring and stable homes for Alabama's foster children.

Through working with Big Oak Ranch Communities and the state of Alabama, more children will receive the chance they desperately need, leading to cycles broken and lives changed.

Big Oak Ranch continues to take no state or federal funds and since the ministry's launch, Big Oak Ranch Communities is already established in Birmingham – with foster parents ready to provide stability and care for the children in their homes.

Big Oak Ranch Communities continues to train foster parents, work with the state Department of Human Resources staff and work toward our goal of having the greatest impact for abused, abandoned and neglected children this country has ever seen.

More Communities are planned for other areas across Alabama, with the hope of providing meaningful change in local communities across the state by building nurturing, caring environments where children in need can encounter the love of Jesus.





Lives Changed


FOR CHRISTIAN STEPHENS,

“When my daughter asked me what it meant, I explained, ‘I’m a first-generation student so that you don’t have to be.’” Christian’s words carry the weight of a journey rooted in hope and nurtured by the care and stability she found at Big Oak Girls’ Ranch.

Her stole wasn’t just a piece of fabric — it was a symbol of progress and a promise to her children that their futures could look different from her past.

“This stole was more than just a piece of fabric for me; it represented something profound. It was pivotal and monumental — a symbol of my journey that I hope paves the way for success not just for me, but for them as well.” From her early days at the Ranch to walking across the stage with her degree in hand, Christian is living proof that where you start doesn’t determine where you’ll finish. Her story is a testament to strength, perseverance, and the power of legacy — not just for herself, but for every generation that follows.





Riding Toward Courage

Eight weeks of Hope, horses and learning to trust again.

Under the lights of the arena, 92 children showed they had what it takes to climb into a saddle and ride through a series of challenges — something that, just eight weeks earlier, many had never even imagined. P21, rooted in Proverbs 21:31, helps the children of Big Oak Ranch not only face and overcome fears, but also discover what it truly means to trust.

The horse becomes a tangible picture of life's obstacles—towering, uncertain and hard to face. In that place of learning, the instructor's steady hand and calm voice lead the way, showing each child that following trusted guidance brings safety, confidence and victory. It's a living reflection of the greater truth when we learn to recognize and follow the voice of Jesus ... we can face the battles of our past and ride forward into the life He has promised.

For eight weeks, the arena becomes a place where courage starts to take shape. Each riding lesson is paired with a truth from Scripture, weaving together the rhythm of horsemanship and the heartbeat of faith. Through these lessons, children learn about living a life with a foundation built on trusting the Hope that is Jesus. By the time the rodeo lights come on, the ride is no longer just about horses; it's about trusting and following the One who leads.

In the end, P21 is more than eight weeks of riding — it's eight weeks of showing a child that he or she is braver than they believed and showing them the Hope that is found in Christ.
