Since 1974, Big Oak Ranch has been called to meet the needs of over 2,000 children, ages 6 to 18, from all over the United States by giving them a solid, Christian home and a chance to realize and fulfill God's plan for their lives.

Big Oak Ranch is a non-profit, non-denominational organization that is privately funded and operates debt-free. Because of God's blessings and our faithful supporters, over the last 50+ years we have grown from living in a farmhouse serving five boys to currently serving over 200 children at Big Oak Boys' Ranch in Gadsden and Big Oak Girls' Ranch in Springville, as well as through our college ministry at ASCEND in Birmingham, through Big Oak Cattle and through Planting Oaks, our international outreach ministry and Child Placing Agency.

Yet, there are still millions of abused, abandoned and neglected children across our country who need intervention on their behalf – with nearly 6,000 of these children in the foster care system in the State of Alabama. Therefore, as we continue to scale toward 20 homes each at both the Boys' Ranch and Girls' Ranch over the next decade, we are extending our mission of relieving the suffering of children through Big Oak Ranch Communities for foster children in Alabama. Our 10-year vision is to strategically span the State of Alabama, building Communities within Communities, while striving to retain the culture that we have created over the last 50+ years of serving children. Together, our goal is to have the greatest impact and influence this country has ever seen for abandoned, abused and neglected children.

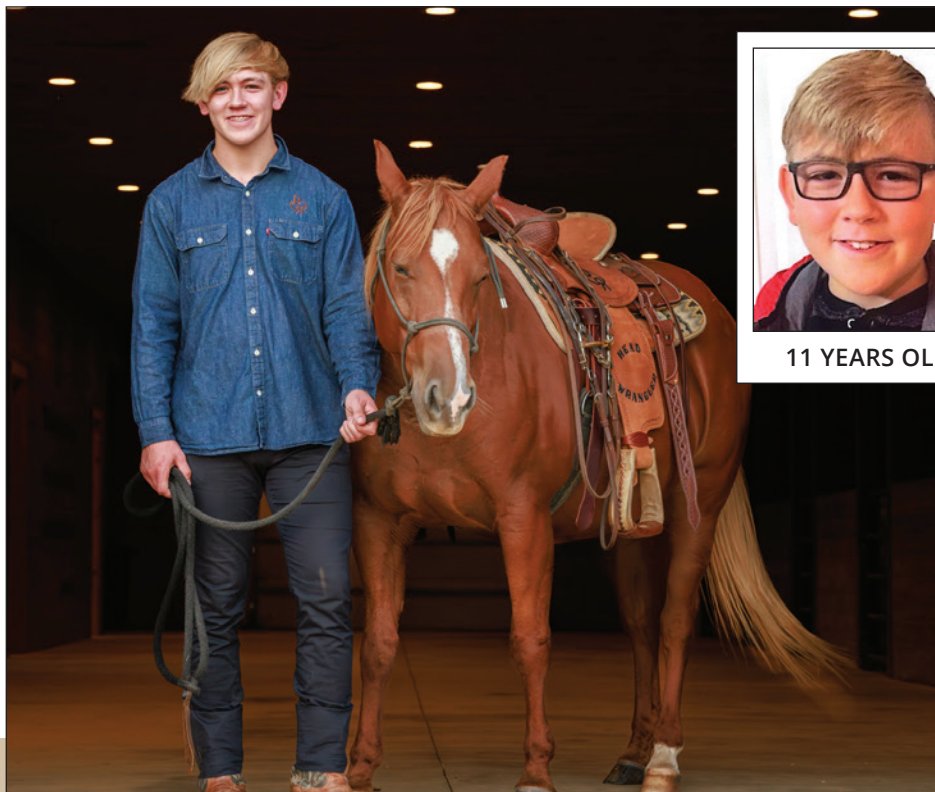

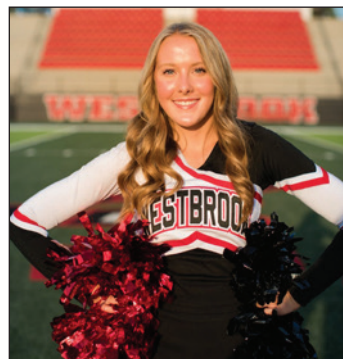

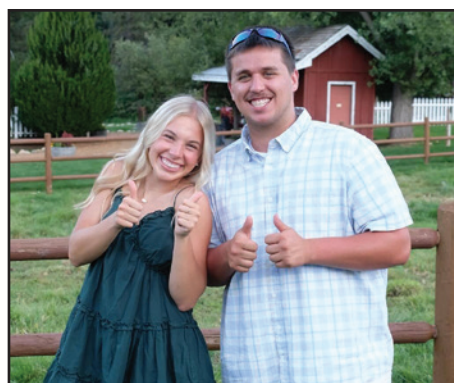

A LIFE CHANGED

JEFF'S STORY



Jeff, age 12

My story may break some hearts, but it should be used to give hope. No matter where we are in life, we can change the outcome.

When you decide to take control of your life, it will be a challenge. To change your life, you must change your mind.

My childhood before the Ranch was not the best. I never knew my father, and my mother left us with people we did not know, and never returned. We were poor and I remember being abused and neglected. We moved around frequently, and by the time I was 12, I had attended four schools.

In 1996, I was 12 when my two brothers and I moved to Big Oak Ranch. I was confused when we were dropped off and thought we were staying briefly.

I was met with love and compassion from my first set of house parents, Danny and Liz Gilbert. Despite their willingness to love me, I wanted nothing to do with them. With their constant love and grace, I started to learn to accept love. I am thankful they did not give up on me, because God knows I was (and sometimes still am) as stubborn as they come.

Later, I moved in with Art and Mary Ebert. Despite my efforts to drive them away, again, I was met with love and compassion and their home is where I learned how to love, show compassion, and give and accept grace.

I remember many times Mom Ebert saying “know that you know that you know” when talking to me about Jesus. Years later, those talks would help me understand my relationship with God.

During my time at the Ranch, I was blessed to attend Westbrook and I had no idea how much it would impact my life. This is where I would learn a life lesson that I carry with me to this day.

My junior year, I had Mr. Finlayson for Bible class, and he taught a series on boundaries. As a self-centered teenager this meant nothing to me, but later would become the foundation that I would use to become the man I am today.

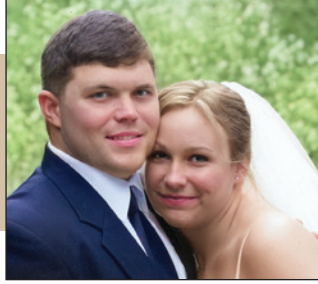


Also, at WCS, I met a wonderful lady by the name of Jamie Hamby (now my wife). She was wonderful and I was a jerk, but she agreed to a date. We dated on and off through school and I continued to be a jerk. Many

years later, despite my best efforts, I tried to date her again and she said no. Despite her best efforts to get rid of me, God had a plan.

I served in the Army from 2004-09. The discipline I learned at the Ranch helped me and I was promoted to sergeant quickly. I had two deployments overseas - to Afghanistan and Iraq. The truck I was in was hit with a roadside bomb, and shortly after that I lost a mentor to a bomb.

I began to lose faith and became bitter. On May 30, 2019, I lost one of my soldiers to suicide, and again, on May 6, 2022, I lost a peer from the Army to suicide. The unit that I served in from 2004-09 has lost about 15 to suicide, and, because of these events and more, I began to struggle with suicidal ideation. I decided to start testing everything I knew and believed. I decided to seek help, and that is when I realized that my faith was stronger than I had ever known. To “know that you know that you know” is a freedom that is unexplainable unless you have been there.

Through the struggles in my life, I have become very secure as a person. I have learned to grow and become better, I had to confront my past, because I had let it become bigger than who I wanted to become. Learning to voluntarily confront my issues is where I learned to become comfortable with the uncomfortable. I had spent so much time and energy trying to convince myself that I was good, that I grew weary. Becoming comfortable with who I am and the things that I have been through has been extremely uncomfortable, but with micro improvements and brutal honesty, I know that I know.

I married Jamie and our two girls – born in 2010 and 2012, respectively - attend Westbrook and I hope and pray that it will have the same impact on them.

Even though I have failed miserably as a man, dad, and husband at times, I strive to be the best in all aspects of my life. It is only by the grace of my Savior that I have been married to the most wonderful woman for 17 years and have two brilliant daughters. Each day I strive to “break the cycle” and instill in our children the lessons I have carried from the Ranch.

Thank you to everyone who has been there – from staff, houseparents, Westbrook, my wonderful resource family (my family) and my wife. I thank you for not giving up on me.

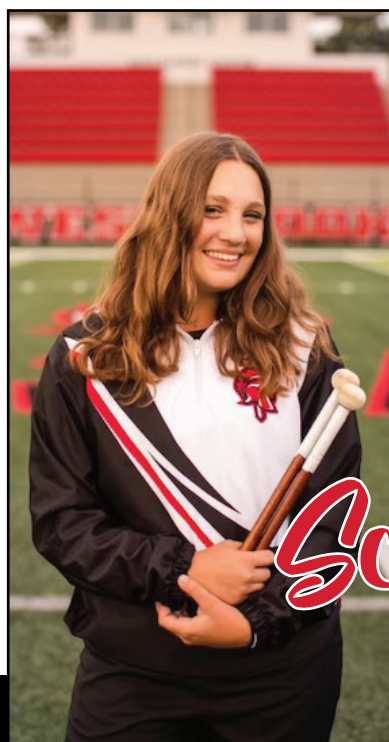
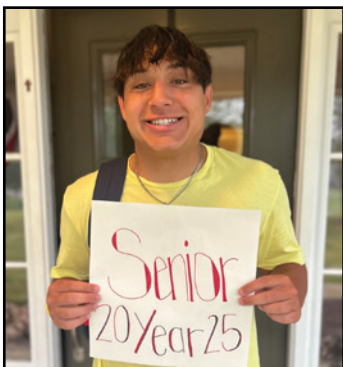
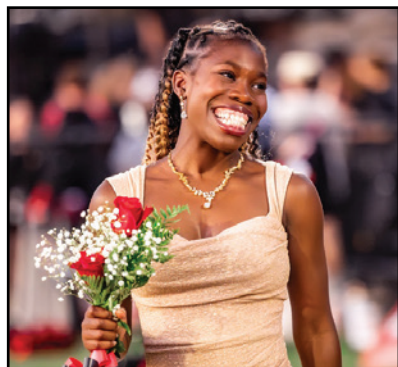

My journey to Big Oak Ranch is something I could never have pieced together. From band directing to websites, nothing seems to have a common thread. What I have come to find every day is that God has always had a specific plan for my life from the beginning.

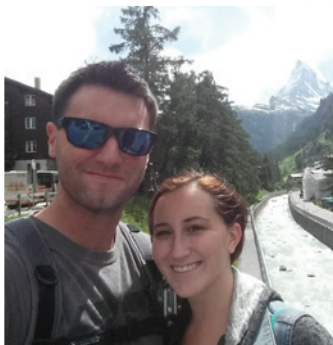
As a Marine officer's child born in Maryland, I lived in Virginia, Kansas, and Colorado before settling in California, where my dad retired. I spent my school years traveling between my mom's and dad's homes, focused on the medical field because it felt like what I was supposed to do.

Midway through my senior year, I suddenly questioned whether I was making the right decisions and faced a fork in the road: my personal life plan or what God was preparing me for. Met with the harsh reality of abandoning my planned degree after sending out college applications, I had to trust that a paved path lay before me that I could not yet see. Upon giving up control, within two months, I had received a scholarship to a university with one of the best music education programs in the state. The moment I stopped trying to control my life, I found myself traveling in the direction God had laid before me.

My degree took me through my first career as a high school music program director. While serving at Temescal Canyon High School (2012 - 2022), I had the honor of working with over 700 students, their parents, music staff, and many others performing throughout the West Coast and Hawaii. Additionally, I had the opportunity to work with Broken City Percussion, an independent indoor percussion program, for the majority of my tenure as director.

After about eight years, I began to feel a familiar unease. The path I was on began to fork again, and I found myself looking up for direction. Not long after, the answer dropped right in front of me, like someone handing me twenty boxes of pizza. I stumbled on a Facebook post that read, "If I didn't want to direct bands anymore, what could I do?" Among the comments, one stood out: "Be a project manager." After a bit of research, I discovered the PMP certification. I immediately began working toward it while applying for jobs, trusting God to lead my family and me to the next step.

Unlike my previous transition, which lasted 2 months, this one lasted 2 years. I had many conversations that fell flat until my cousin called and told me about a job opportunity in Birmingham. Upon setting up the interview, the company assumed I was a local to Birmingham. Instead of

correcting them, my father-in-law helped me book a red-eye flight for the next day to make the in-person interview, which earned me the job.

After my relocation during the busy Christmas season (which I can't say I recommend), I spent 2.5 years managing website, video, and branding projects. Right when I thought my transition was complete, I discovered I was still in God's planned transition towards Big Oak Ranch. A website project evolved into fulfilling a prayer I hadn't dared to voice. What I initially saw as a two-year transition turned out to be a five-year journey to prepare me for my current role.

Every day, I look forward to seeing what God has planned next and am honored to be part of Big Oak's story. Outside of the office, my second-grade sweetheart Erin and I have been married for over 12 years and have two children, Melody and Evan. We are kept busy with baseball, theater, and other everyday adventures.
